



Laura is the Founder | Director of the Centenary Suzuki School (CSS) and is on the violin faculty of Centenary College. She received her B.M. and M.M. degrees in violin performance from U.T. at Austin. Laura taught in the U.T. String Project, received teacher training under Dr. Shinichi Suzuki, attended the Juilliard Teachers Symposium, and observed master classes at the Curtis Institute where her cellist son was a student. Laura started the Suzuki school after moving to Shreveport in 1977. Armed with her “Fuller Brush Kit” of miniature violins, a violin record album, and a poster of her young U.T. students, she began knocking on doors of prospective students and invited them to take violin lessons. Beginning with ten students, today, the CSS has 165 students with eight “Suzuki method” teachers providing instruction in violin, viola and cello. In 2004, 150+ CSS students partnered with the Shreveport Symphony to present, “Home for the Holidays” in a sold out performance. More than 1,000 students have received weekly, private and group training in the Centenary Suzuki School generating offers of 30+ million in scholarship dollars from colleges seeking academically and musically talented students. Laura has written hundreds of recommendation letters to colleges and summer music programs for CSS students.

Through the generous support of Centenary College, CSS is now the largest Suzuki program in Louisiana. Laura, along with the Shreveport Suzuki Parents Association produce frequent Suzuki workshops in which nationally acclaimed Suzuki clinicians are brought in to work with area students. Many Shreveport professionals site CSS’s specialized music study as a key factor attracting and keeping them in the Shreveport community. CSS has given students not only musical skills, but strives to create good citizens and to preserve classical music for generations to come. Students are taught service to others by playing locally for the Glen, Holy Angels, Live Oak and the Revel. Laura’s efforts have helped to mold young lives generating hundreds of college and career ready students. All have gained valuable skills used to earn a living, to exercise self-discipline and to achieve excellence. Most importantly, Suzuki students develop a good heart and a love of music that will enrich their lives forever.

Laura plays in the Shreveport Symphony, Baroque Artists of Shreveport, and performs at many area churches, especially her church, First Methodist. Her students are members of Cincinnati Symphony, Johannesburg Philharmonic, Shreveport Symphony, orchestras in Germany and the U.S. CSS students have attended prestigious schools such as Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Brown, Stanford, Emory, Curtis Institute of Music, Tulane, Rice, Centenary, and many other fine institutions.

Laura is from Memphis, TN. Her father, Dr. Robert Popper, a physician and cellist, emigrated from Austria to the U.S. in 1939 bringing with him his family’s musical instruments. Her Mississippi mother played piano with Laura on church hymns. Laura is married to Ed Crawford; together they have supported numerous guest artists with the Shreveport Symphony and established and funded a Classical Listening Program at Southfield School, where Laura established a CSS Satellite Program. All four sons appreciate their participation in the CSS commenting that CSS’s multi-ethnic membership provided their most culturally diverse experience in Shreveport. Edward IV works at Goldman Sachs in Miami, Robert works at Atco Investment Company, Andrew is owner of Crawford Design and Rhino Coffee, and John-Henry is pursuing a career as a cellist.



FitzGerald Plumbing and Heating Co was formed in 1914 by Bob's grandfather William FitzGerald, an Irish immigrant who had come to America with his new wife and a valuable education in Ireland's plumbing trade. William's two sons, Willie and Dick, followed him into the business and took over for their father after World War II. For the next 25 years, the brothers ran FitzGerald's with a focus on employees, treating everyone as family and carrying on their father's unwavering integrity. It was this atmosphere into which the next generation of company leaders was born. Bob and his cousins, Mike and Tim (Dick's two sons), grew up working summers and holidays, first in the warehouse and then on the construction jobs. Their employment in the family business at such early ages instilled in them a truly important life lessons; in order for a business to be successful, the business' well-being must be of foremost concern as decisions are made.

Bob embarked on his path to employment at FitzGerald's at Vanderbilt University in 1964. He married his high school sweetheart, Patsy in 1965 and returned to LA Tech University to complete his education. Having completed his Bachelor of Science degrees in Mechanical Engineering and Business Administration, the next step was earning his journeyman plumbing license. After graduation, Bob continued to work in the field for two years. Bob's career took him through most of the positions at FitzGerald's: journeyman plumber, service estimator, service manager, project manager, president, and then CEO. The company motto — "Whatever it takes" was his approach to working with customers to solve problems. This approach served him well when guiding his employees through interactions with customers. Retiring in January 2012, Bob was extremely proud to turn the family business over to his son, Chris, the fourth generation FitzGerald to lead this company.

Bob's first encounter with Junior Achievement was in the early 1970's, when he was asked to teach a class of plumbing apprentices about the free enterprise system. Bob's dad pointed him to JA's literature as a foundation for the class and he quickly learned what this organization had to offer.

Giving back to his community, industry and service to his church were always part of Bob's day. Over his career, Bob served as vestry member several times, and as Junior Warden and Senior Warden at St. Mark's Episcopal Cathedral, and on the Board of Trustees at Episcopal Theology Seminary of the Southwest in Austin, TX. Community involvement included serving on the board of Shreveport Chamber of Commerce, Broadmoor Y.M.C.A., and Shreveport Committee of 100 as well as serving as board member and president of Northwest LA Chapter of the American Red Cross, Shreveport Club, LSU-Shreveport Foundation and several local contractor associations. National service to his industry included serving as board member and national president of the National Environmental Balancing Bureau, the Mechanical Contractors Association of American and the Mechanical Contracting Education & Research Foundation. Bob and Patsy have been blessed with three children, who have given us the absolute joy of being involved in the lives of our eight incredible grandchildren!!!


