n 1923, Mr. John J. Doles, Sr., a former state senator, and Madge Doles welcomed the birth of their son, John Doles, Jr.

In 1940, John Doles, Jr. graduated from Plain Dealing High School and went on to graduate from Louisiana State University in 1948 with a Bachelor of Science in Petroleum Engineering.

Mr. John Doles, Jr. began his road to success by joining the military in 1942; he retired from the United States Army Reserve as a LTC in 1962. While in the military, he was awarded the Purple Heart; Bronze Star; Eame Med with 2 Bronze Stars (Rhine Land, Central Europe); American Camp Medal; and World War II Victory Medal.

Mr. Doles is Chairman of the Board for Doles Insurance Agency Inc. in Plain Dealing, Louisiana. He is also Vice President of the Driscus Oil Corporation in Plain Dealing. Mr. Doles is the former president and chairman of the board of First State Bank and Trust Company in Plain Dealing.

r. Charles Daniel Knight was born on August 21, 1999, in Shreveport, Louisiana to Charles P. Knight 🚰 and Blanche W. Knight. Dr. Knight

graduated Summa cum Laude from Centenary College in 1941, with a Bachelor of Science. He received a Doctorate of Medicine from Tulane University in New Orleans in 1944. In 1951, Dr. Knight received

a M.S. from the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis. He received American Board of Surgery Certification in 1953. He was a Captain in the United States Air Force from 1953 to 1954 - Chief of Surgery, USAF Hospital in Wiesbaden, Germany.

Academic appointments include Clinical Professor, Department of Surgery, LSUMC in Shreveport; Clinical Associate Professor, Department of Surgery, LSUMC, Shreveport; and Clinical Associate Professor, Department of Postgraduate Medicine, LSU in Shreveport. Hospital appointments include Medical Director, Highland Hospital; Staff Surgeon, Highland Hospital; Staff Surgeon, Schumpert Memorial Medical Center; Consulting Surgeon, Barksdale Air Force Base; Chief, Division of General Surgery, Confederate Memorial Medical Center; and Attending Surgeon, Confederate Memorial Medical Center.

Dr. Knight is the recipient of the Sidney K. Simon Award for Academic Excellence, October, 1944. He also holds many honorable titles, such as: 1988 President of the Shreveport Medical Society; Governor of the American College of Surgeons from 1975-1980; President, American College of Surgeon, Louisiana Chapter, 1970-1971; Vice President, Priestley Society (Mayo Clinic Surgical Alumni) in 1968 and President, 1975-1976; and President, Southern Society of Clinical Surgeons, 1984.

Dr. Knight has held memberships with several civic organizations: American Cancer Society, President, 1959-1961; Shreveport Chamber of Commerce, Board of Directors, 1969-1971; and Shreveport Charter Revision Committee, 1970. Dr. Knight has been a member of many alumni associations, social clubs, church board and board of trustee committees. Dr. Knight has written 24 successful publications.

Dr. Knight married Dorothy Willius of Rochester, Minnesota on July 6, 1951. They have four children: Charles Daniel Knight, Jr., M.D.; Fredrick Willius Knight, M.D.; Daniel Robert Knight, M.D.; and John Thomas Knight, M.D.

Hal Sutton



al Sutton, a native of Shreveport, was among golf's brightest stars

in the mid-1980's with seven victories in the first five years on the PGA TOUR. As a rookie in 1982, he posted three seconds, a third and in the season's final event - Walt Disney World Golf Classic his first victory.

Hal Sutton led wire-to-wire on the PGA TOUR, defeating Jack Nicklaus by one stroke. He trailed John Cook by four strokes, entering the final round of the Tournament of Players Championship, before closing at 69 to give him a one-stoke victory.

Hal experienced a few low points until 1994, when he earned status in the top 50 earnings category. He received the Hilton Bounceback Award as a result. In 1995 he returned to the winner's circle at the B.C. Open. Closing 10-under par 61, moved him from T21 to a one-stroke victory. The win was the best final round by the winner since Johnny Miller at the 1975 Dean Martin Tucson Open.

Hal Sutton is the 1998 winner of the TOUR Championship (through 2001). In 1998, Mr. Sutton reestablished himself as one of the top players on TOUR and won twice in one season for first time since 1986.

National teams with which Mr. Sutton is associated: Walker Cup (2), 1979, 1981; USA vs. Japan, 1983; Ryder Cup (2), 1985, 1987; Nissan Cup, 1986; The President's Cup, 1998 (withdrew). In 1999, Mr. Sutton won the Canadian Open. Mr. Sutton was the leading U.S. player with 3-1/2 points and led the win at the 1999 U.S. Ryder Cup.

In 1999, Mr. Sutton was inducted into the Greater Shreveport Chamber of Commerce's Walk of Stars. The Walk of Stars recognizes lifetime achievements of citizens from Northwest Louisiana.

Away from the golfing greens, Hal enjoys riding horses, hunting and fishing. Hal Sutton, born April 28, 1958, turned professional golfer in 1981. Hal graduated from Centenary College in Shreveport. Mr. Sutton and his wife Ashley have three daughters: Samantha Jean, Sara Rias and Sadie Ann.

as Program Manager in 1984 and became Executive Director in 1985. In May of 1992, Linda returned as president of Junior Achievement following a threeyear absence.

Under Linda's direction, Junior Achievement of North Louisiana received many honors from the national organization of Junior Achievement, including three Summit Awards, Peak Performance Awards for both student and financial growth and the prestigious Golden Circle Award which is only presented to the top 10% of Junior Achievement areas.

Since 1992, student participation in Junior Achievement programs in North Louisiana increased from 1400 to 9600 and funding increased 278%. Linda worked with the local Board of Directors to create the North Louisiana Business Hall of Fame and the Junior Achievement Endowment Fund.

Linda has also been active in the community serving as president of Quota International of Shreveport; president of the National Society of Fund Raising Executives; and president of the Women's Business Council. She has been a director of the Greater Shreveport Chamber of Commerce, Sales and Marketing Executives; Better Business Bureau; Business Exchange, Inc.; and Northwood Country Club. She currently serves as Junior Warden of Church of the Atonement Episcopal Church and is Second Vice President of the Shreveport Women's Commission.

Linda believes that children are our future and that we have an obligation to teach them to understand and value the free enterprise system.
