## *2013 Junior Achievement Laureate*

**DR. JAMES B. HENDERSON**

*Chancellor, Bossier Parish Community College*

As Chancellor of Bossier Parish Community College, Dr. Jim Henderson leads a learning-centered institution with enrollment of more than 8,500 students that is focused on expanding student access and success, and responding to the needs of the regional economy. BPCC is renowned for utilizing technology to deliver innovative programs to students any time, any place.

Prior to becoming Chancellor of Bossier Parish Community College, Henderson was the Senior Vice President for Career and Technical Education at the Louisiana Community & Technical College System. He was responsible for shaping the purpose and direction of the system's workforce development efforts. He provided strategic oversight for the customized training and corporate services of the system's seven community colleges, two technical community colleges, and the eight regional technical education centers. Mr. Henderson was also responsible for overseeing operations of the Louisiana Technical Colleges.

As a former Director of Administration and Incumbent Worker Programs for the Louisiana Department of Labor, he headed numerous statewide initiatives to improve workforce development. While at the Louisiana Department of Labor, he provided direction for a \$50 million workforce training program, focusing the program vision on meeting employer and workforce training needs. Prior to joining Labor, he spent 15 years in executive level management roles in the private sector.

He has a bachelor's degree in journalism and English, a Master of Science degree in Human Performance Technology, and a Doctor of Management from University of Maryland. He has also completed the Institute for Educational Management at the Harvard Graduate School of Education. He and his wife Tonia have three children, Reagan, Nicholas, and Alexander.

## *2013 Junior Achievement Laureate*

**DR. LACY H. WILLIAMS**

*Founder & President, Will-Drill Resources, Inc.*

When Lacy Williams was fifteen years old, he spent his summer digging ditches under the hot East Texas sun. From that moment on, he knew he wanted to use his mind for a living rather than his hands. Born in Dallas in 1938, but raised in Longview, Lacy Holmes Williams graduated from Longview High School and went on to study at the University of Texas at Austin. From there he entered the University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston where he earned his medical degree with honors and was a member of Alpha Omega Alpha honor medical society. After his first year, Lacy married Edie Broyles, his high school sweetheart. He interned at Hermann Hospital, Houston and

returned to the medical branch for his residency in Radiology. During those years they had three children, Lacy II, Evelyn and Allen.

Upon completion of his residency, the family moved to Baltimore where he served as a radiologist in the United State Public Health Service during the Vietnam War. In 1969, they settled in Shreveport, Louisiana where Lacy joined the radiology group of Drs. Carroll, Carlisle and Marshall at Schumpert Hospital. A few years later, their fourth child, Claire was born. Lacy practiced medicine at Schumpert until his retirement in 1998. Additionally during his medical career he served as Chief of Radiology at Schumpert and as president of the Radiology Society of Louisiana. He was also active in the American College of Radiology where he was elected a Fellow.

While in Baltimore, Lacy began his investing career, becoming friends with a neighbor with whom he continues to invest. Following in family tradition upon moving to Shreveport, he started to invest in oil and gas projects. In the late 1970s, Lacy founded Williams-Geiger Resources to explore for oil and gas and continued to do so until the early 1980s when he and his partners sold the company. A few years later with his son Allen having graduated from college, they began building an active oil and gas exploration company. Will-Drill Resources remains one of the most active companies in the region. Lacy invests in other areas as well including real estate, timber and ranching. He loves to invite brokers and other investors to go fishing with him on his ranch in East Texas where they talk about opportunities while catching largemouth bass.

Lacy supports the community of Shreveport through his chairing of the campaign for Sutton Children's Hospital with his wife Edie for which the Louisiana State Medical Society honored him with the Community Service Award. They have also given the Circle of Excellence Plaza at Louisiana State University – Shreveport plus endowed an academic excellence scholarship. Upon his retiring from medicine, Lacy and Edie returned to their hometown of Longview, Texas, where they are active in the Kilgore Historical Preservation Society by the giving of a derrick in honor of their 50th anniversary and the dedication of the Jack and Thelma Williams Garden at the First Baptist Church in Longview. In addition to their four children, Lacy and Edie have seven grandchildren.

Association Board, Sci-Port Discovery Center Board, the LSUS Foundation Board, American Fire Sprinkler Association Board Secretary and the Shreveport-Bossier Military Affairs Council Board. Professional involvement also includes Associated General Contractors, and National Association of Women in Construction.

Community service evokes a strong commitment from Linda. She was appointed by Lt. General Jim Kowalski, AFGSC Commander to serve as a charter member of the Air Force Global Strike Command Civic Leader Program 2010-2013. Linda is a community partner with the Cyber Innovation Center, I-49 North Coalition, Sheriff's Safety Town and the Minority Supplier Institute. In 2010, she served as the first woman President of the Committee of One Hundred and currently serves on the Board. In 2013, Linda was appointed to the Ambassador Program for Louisiana Economic Development. In 2011, Mayor Cedric Glover appointed her to the City of Shreveport Architect and Engineers Selection Committee, which she still serves. She aspires to help the local community so she established the Fire Tech Systems Scholarship Program for ambitious and aspiring young ladies whose studies involve the construction industry. Linda also partners with the National Association of Women in Construction to offer a scholarship through the Caddo Career & Technology Center.

Linda resides in Shreveport, Louisiana with her husband Richard and two daughters, Emily and Nikki. Her family is actively involved and supportive of their church, Grace Community Methodist Church.




