Lennis began working at Lincove & Evans, now Cole, Evans & Peterson, and never looked back. To say it was a great match would be an understatement. From there, she 'accidentally' became a CPA. Lennis has been able to share her natural and developed abilities inside this formidable group. She has a unique propensity to get at what's really important within a group and the courage to get others to join in her vision. She is a fearless problem solver with a willingness to 'say anything' and the graceful understanding that in order to WIN, someone else does NOT have to LOSE.

After graduating from Jesuit High School (now Loyola College Prep) in 1974, Robert attended **Robert G. Pou** Romph & Pou Agency

Louisiana State University (LSU) in Baton Rouge where he earned a journalism degree. During his college years, Robert worked part-time as a sports reporter for The Morning Advocate and as a sales representative for the LSU Daily Reveille. He was also an active member in the Theta Xi fraternity.

His first job after college was in radio sales for KMBQ/KEEL in Shreveport, but his passion for marketing soon led him to strike out on his own. With business partner Anne Gremillion, Gremillion & Pou Advertising opened its doors in 1981. Starting a business from scratch is never easy, however. Through a combination of marketing savvy, a dedication to providing exceptional client service and pure grit, the agency not only survived but also thrived.

What began as a two-person advertising and marketing agency has grown into the second largest agency in Louisiana. Renamed Romph & Pou Agency after Anne's retirement from the company in 2016, R&P Agency today is an award-winning agency employing more than 100 people across four locations in Louisiana and Texas.

Over the years, Robert's outstanding business success has been recognized with the Top 20 Small Businesses of Louisiana Award in 2002; the Loyola College Prep Hall of Honor Induction in 2010; and LSU's Top 100 Fastest Growing Tiger Businesses in 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2021.

Robert has remained at the helm throughout the nearly 41 years of the agency's success, alongside co-owner Jeffrey Romph since 2016. With clients in multiple industries across the country, R&P Agency's robust client portfolio includes Brookshire Grocery Company, The ICEE® Company, Ochsner Health System, Calumet Specialty Products, WinStar World Casino and Resort, and Palm Beach Zoo & Conservation Society.

He has also dedicated much of his time to the Shreveport community and his beloved LSU. Robert has served on numerous boards, including the Committee of 100 Shreveport-Bossier City Board, the Shreveport Chamber of Commerce Board, the LSU Manship School of Communications Advisory Board, and for St. Joseph Catholic School; as past-president of the Board of Trustees of Loyola College Prep and the Ark-La-Tex Tigers; and, perhaps his all-time favorite, as a Little League Baseball and Softball Coach.

Robert and his wife Barbara are proud parents of Gray and Chase Anne. They were thrilled to become grandparents in 2020 to Robert Gray Pou III. He enjoys playing golf and time at the beach. Of course, Robert is also an avid LSU sports fan.

2022 BUSINESS Hall of Fame

Graham A. Walker Fibrebond, Inc.

Graham Walker is a lifelong North Louisiana native. He was raised in Taylor, Louisiana, in Bienville Parish, near his grandparents and numerous aunts, uncles, and cousins. Some of his fondest memories of Shreveport include having a Shrimp Buster at Herby K's with his father or sitting for lunch at the Strawn's counter with his mother.

Graham is the 4th child of Claud and Andrea Walker. From a young age, he witnessed the importance of hard work as his father founded Fibrebond in 1982. His summers in high school and college were spent working either in Fibrebond manufacturing facility or on his brother's farm in Hosston, LA.

After graduating from Cedar Creek School in Ruston, Graham attended Sewanee and majored in History. The foundation of a classical liberal arts education has proved useful in unexpected ways. At Sewanee, he graduated magna cum laude with Honors, was elected Phi Beta Kappa, and served as Chairman of the Honor Council. While there, he met another North Louisiana native, Susannah Peterson of Shreveport. After Sewanee, Graham received his MBA from LSU in Baton Rouge.

In 2004, Graham and Susannah married and lived in Shreveport while she attended medical school. Today, they have four children: Mary (15), Cecelia (14), Frances (10) and Henry (3).

Graham joined Fibrebond in 2004 at a time when the business was struggling from the brutal effects of the .com bubble and the post 9/11 recession. For the next decade, Fibrebond continued to focus on its core wireless telecom business.

In 2015, Graham was named President and Chief Executive Officer at a pivotal moment in Fibrebond's history. The wireless market was shrinking and the business either had to shrink or attempt to reinvent itself. In 2015, Fibrebond had a 95% concentration in 3 customers. By 2019, those 3 customers represented less than 2% of Fibrebond's revenues.

Today, Fibrebond is the leader in industrialized prefabrication and construction. The company engineers and builds projects for the world's most complex industries. From its manufacturing operations in Webster Parish, Fibrebond exports over 90% of its work outside of Louisiana. The company continues to invest in and expand its Louisiana operations.

Graham is an advocate for North Louisiana's potential as a place to work and live. He is involved in several local efforts to improve the region's economy so that people can return home to North Louisiana, including the North Louisiana Economic Partnership and the BRF.

Graham and his family attend the Cathedral of St John Berchmans, where Graham currently serves as the Chair of the Parish Finance Council.

JA Be Entrepreneurial

provides middle school students an opportunity to experience the initial steps necessary to start a business. New program content provides an authentic entrepreneurial experience for students, with each session building up to a product-pitch competition.






