
Many symbols were considered to try to capture the true meaning of the Junior Achievement of North Louisiana Business Hall of Fame, but one stood out – the sun.



Dr. John C. McDonald



John Clifton McDonald, M. D., was born in Baldwyn, MS on July 25, 1930. He received his Bachelor of Science degree from Mississippi College in 1951 and his doctorate in medicine from Tulane University School of Medicine in New Orleans in 1955. He interned at Confederate Memorial Medical Center (now LSU

Hospital in Shreveport) before taking his general surgery residency at State University of New York at Buffalo.

Since November 2000, Dr. McDonald has served as Chancellor and Dean of the LSU Health Sciences Center in Shreveport. During his tenure, the LSUHSC in Shreveport has expanded and now includes three professional schools as well as the LSU Hospital on the Shreveport campus and the E. A. Conway Medical Center in Monroe.

Prior to becoming the chief executive officer of the LSUH-SC in Shreveport, Dr. McDonald was Professor and Head of the Department of Surgery in the LSU School of Medicine in Shreveport, and Surgeon-in-Chief for the LSU Hospital. Among the pioneers in organ transplantation, Dr. McDonald was already nationally prominent by 1977 when he came to Shreveport and established the forerunner of today's Louisiana State University/Willis-Knighton Medical Center Regional Transplant Center. Dr. McDonald served as founding director of the LSU/WK Transplant Center until 2000.

Dr. McDonald is past President of the United Network for Organ Sharing, the South-Eastern Organ Procurement Foundation, the American Society of Transplant Surgeons, the Southern Surgical Association, the Surgical Association of Louisiana, the Halsted Society and the Louisiana Organ Procurement Agency. His recent honors include the Roswell Park Medal given in recognition of his achievements in the art and science of surgery, one of The Times Top Ten Leaders of the Century, the Shreveport Medical Society Distinguished Service Award, and a lifetime achievement award bestowed by the South-Eastern Organ Procurement Foundation. He is a member of numerous medical organizations and is author of more than 200 contributions to the surgical literature.

Dr. McDonald is married to Martha Dennis McDonald and they have three daughters: Melissa McDonald, Karen McDonald Lairmore, and Martha McDonald Whyte, M. D. They also have five grandchildren: Daniel Lairmore, Ashley Lairmore, Sarah Lairmore, Hayden Whyte and Emma Whyte.





Mr. George E. McInnis



Tr. George E. McInnis is a native of Minden, Louisiana where he graduated from high school in 1963. He received his Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering from Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge. While at Louisiana State University, he was a member of

the Kappa Alpha Fraternity.

Directly after college, Mr. McInnis returned to Minden to enter the construction business with his father, John L. McInnis and his uncle, Harry E. McInnis, Sr. Currently, Mr. McInnis serves as Chairman of the Board of McInnis Brothers Construction, Inc., a General Construction Company. He and his partners, Harry E. McInnis and M. Philip McInnis operate the company.

Through the years, Mr. McInnis has been very involved with his church and his community. He has served on the Vestry of St. John's Episcopal Church in Minden many times and additionally, has served as Senior Warden. Mr. McInnis has been the Chairman of the Minden Chamber of Commerce and in 1991, he was named Minden Man of the Year. At present, he is a member of the Committee of One Hundred in Shreveport, a Trustee of the Public Affairs Research Council, and serves as Chairman of the Executive Committee of the State Fair of Louisiana.

Mr. McInnis was instrumental in the formation of the Minden Main Street project. He served as its president for six years. Minden Main Street is responsible for rebuilding the vitality of the Minden Downtown Business District.

Mr. McInnis has served twice as president of the Shreveport chapter of Associated General Contractors and has been involved in Cotillion for many years serving as King Rex VII in 2000. Mr. McInnis has also been active in military affairs. He is a member of the 8th Air Force Consultation Committee and the Shreveport-Bossier Military Affairs Council, the "Eagles".

Mr. McInnis is married to Boopie McInnis and they are members of St. John's Episcopal Church in Minden. They have three children, Sterrett Procter McInnis, Brandon McInnis and Crawford Elam McInnis; two daughters-in-law, Samantha McInnis and Mary McInnis; and four grandchildren, Lawson McInnis, Sterrett McInnis, Ford McInnis, and May McInnis.





Dr. Donald A. Webb



May 4, 1926 in a small mining town in Wales. After winning a scholarship to a good school, he went on to Cambridge University, before joining the British Royal Navy in World War II. He served eight years in the Royal Navy, mainly minesweeping and

finally as Captain of H. M. S. Switha.

In 1953, Dr. Webb resigned his commission, and emigrated with his family to the United States to become a Methodist Minister. He received a Bachelor of Arts Degree with honors from Ohio Wesleyan University in 1960. In 1963, he received a Master of Divinity from Methodist Theological School in Ohio, and in 1966, a Ph.D. in Literature and Theology from Drew University.

Dr. Webb was ordained in the United Methodist Church of the United States in 1963. He held the position of Visiting Professor of Religion at Drew University from 1967 until 1968. He was Professor of Literature and Theology, and Vice President of the Methodist Theological School in Ohio from 1968 until 1977. In 1977, he became President of Centenary College of Louisiana and held that position until 1991. Currently, Dr. Webb is President Emeritus of Centenary College. Since retirement, he has been Interim Senior Pastor of several churches including First United Methodist Church of Shreveport where he still serves as Scholar-in-Residence. Dr. Webb has also authored a number of publications including, Deep Calls to Deep, a volume of Biblical Studies.

Dr. Webb is a Board Member of the Mayor's Prayer Breakfast, Volunteers of America, and The LightHouse. He has received many honors including the Daughters of the American Revolution's "Americanism" Award, March of Dimes' "Citizen of the Year", "Mr. Shreveport Award" from the Optimist Club, and the Universal Human Rights Service Award. He has also received Humanitarian Awards from three service organizations.

Married for 58 years to his wife Renee, they have five children, Cheryl, Marian, Chris, Alison and Ian. They also have eight grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
