Last year JA provided lessons to 7, 233 students with 48,000 contact hours. This translates into \$1,436,000 of service to area students.

For the second year, Junior Achievement of North Louisiana has been recognized as a 5 Star Area. We have significantly increased student contact hours and are financially sound with six months operating capital enabling JA to make plans to serve additional students.

Thirty five of the 111 JA areas in the US achieved this 5 Star Level. We can all be proud of our community for helping Junior Achievement of North Louisiana be among the elite—my invitation to you is to be a part of making JA North Louisiana a 5 Star program again this year!

General Robin Rand, former Junior Achievement student

Gen. Robin Rand is the Commander, Air Force Global Strike Command, Barksdale Air Force Base, Louisiana. He is responsible for organizing, training, equipping all U.S. intercontinental ballistic missile and bomber forces. The command's mission is to provide strategic deterrence, global strike and combat support. The command comprises more than 31,000 professionals operating at nine wings that control the nation's inventory of Minuteman III intercontinental ballistic missiles, B-1, B-2 and B-52 bomber aircraft.

General Rand was commissioned in 1979 after graduating from the U.S. Air Force Academy. He's had multiple flying tours; served as an air liaison officer with the U.S. Army; and has had staff tours on the Joint Staff, Office of the Secretary of Defense, and Air Staff. General Rand's previous commands include the 36th Fighter Squadron, USAF Weapons School, 8th Fighter Wing, 56th Fighter Wing, 332nd Air Expeditionary Wing at Balad Air Base, Iraq, 12th Air Force (Air Forces Southern), and prior to this assignment, Air Education and Training Command.

General Rand is a command pilot with more than 5,080 flying hours, including more than 470 combat hours.

Congratulations, Jimmy!



James David “Jimmy” Gosslee was born in Providence, RI, January 21, 1949, to Dr. John and Eileen Gosslee. A post-World War II baby, Jimmy’s family moved to Louisiana, where his father joined the Highland Clinic in 1954 as their first orthopedic surgeon.

Jimmy attended South Highland School, Broadmoor Junior High School, and graduated from C. E. Byrd High School in 1967, having played on their football and golf teams. Jimmy graduated from LSU in Baton Rouge in 1971, earning a Bachelor’s degree in Business Administration. During his years at LSU, he was very active in the Kappa Sigma fraternity, serving as rush chairman his junior year, president his senior year, and elected Gamma Chapter’s Kappa Sigma of the Year in 1971.

While in college, he founded Party Pics, a business employing 30 students photographing fraternity and sorority parties for all forty of the fraternal organizations on the LSU campus, and created Graduation Foto, which is still active 45 years later taking photos of over 15,000 Louisiana high school and college graduates per year. After graduation, Jimmy worked for Xerox and led his New Orleans-Baton Rouge region in sales while still running his photo businesses.

Jimmy returned to Shreveport in 1976 and began his real estate career with J. Wesley Dowling, Realtor®, soon became partner, and joined the Coldwell Banker franchise in 1983. Gosslee was elected Chairman and CEO and, with his leadership during the past 40 years, the business grew from sales of \$12 million per year to over \$500 million, and went from 30 agents and staff to 200. It is still family-owned, with his son, Brad Gosslee, becoming Jimmy’s full partner in 2007. Jimmy believes in surrounding yourself with the best talent and takes great pride in providing an environment that promotes success and seeing his people thrive.

Coldwell Banker Gosslee maintains an extraordinary 30% share of the residential market in Shreveport-Bossier, and has earned international recognition and awards throughout the years, including Coldwell Banker Real Estate Chairman’s Circle, given to only the top 4% worldwide for 25 straight years, an extremely rare achievement with the market size of Shreveport-Bossier, and being one of the Top 500 Power Brokers in the United States again in 2016.

In 2010, Governor Bobby Jindal appointed Jimmy to the Louisiana Real Estate Commission (LREC), representing Northwest Louisiana in Baton Rouge. He considers it a privilege to serve the industry that has been so good to him.

Jimmy served as Chairman of the LREC in 2015, was named 2011 Realtor of the Year by the Northwest Louisiana Association of Realtors®, and has served on and led numerous civic and professional boards and organizations, tirelessly promoting and working to improve his community and industry.

Jimmy’s greatest accomplishment is his family: wife of 45 years, Dianne (a saint), children Brad, Jeffrey, and Krista, and nine grandchildren. His motto is the famous quote by Winston Churchill: “Never. Never. Never Give Up.”

Gregory Kallenberg is the founder and executive director of the Film Prize Foundation (Louisiana Film Prize, Startup Prize, Music Prize and Food Prize). He is a proud graduate of the University of Texas and attended the film production program at the University of Southern California. Gregory's endeavors are focused on the incentivizing, evolving and transforming of entrepreneurs, artists and dreamers. His ultimate goal is to transform Northwest Louisiana into a hotbed of innovative people and companies doing and creating incredibly awesome things.



Gregory's "moonshot mission" started with the creation of the award-winning Louisiana Film Prize, a film competition and festival where filmmakers are invited to Shreveport and Bossier City to create short films. The top-rated Film Prize films then compete during Louisiana Film Prize Festival, and the audience helps choose the \$50,000 cash winner (the world's largest cash prize for a short film). While making the Film Prize films, filmmakers hire locals (contributing to workforce development), eat in our restaurants and stay in our hotels. The past five years, the combined economic impact of the Film Prize is close to \$10 million and over 1,000 people have worked on Film Prize movies.

Gregory created the Startup Prize to help educate entrepreneurs, nurture their ideas and then, ultimately, connect them with potential investors. This unique competition encourages the investors to interact with the entrepreneurs and then choose their favorite startups to pitch their ideas in the final round. To date, 40% of the Startup Prize finalists have received offers of funding.

While the founding of the Louisiana Food and Music Prizes were rooted in Gregory's love for indie rock and eating, both festivals have helped musicians and chefs take their burning passions and transform them into viable businesses that connect with an audience. A large part of the Music Prize is hosted by the Grammys and focuses on educating musicians on how to improve their craft and run their music careers like a business. The newest prize is the Louisiana Food Prize. Again, Gregory is attempting to help local restaurant owners and catering chefs find an audience and create viable businesses.

While the success of the Louisiana Film/Music/Food/Startup Prizes has been impressive, Gregory is quick to point out that none of this would be possible without an amazing team of people, including Sabrina Adsit, Chris Lyon, Maddie White and Jana Pruitt, working hard to realize a collective vision, an army of willing and able sponsors and volunteers, and the support of two of the most incredible cities on the planet, Shreveport and Bossier.

Gregory is married to the lovely and amazing Heidi Kallenberg, and they have two children, Tobias and Daisy, three dogs—Savannah, Lulu and Violet—two cats, Rorie and Tut, and a horse named Shania.

Jon Q=Petersen

Jon initiated his business career when he started working in his family's oil and gas exploration business in 1973. Jon was also pursuing a parallel career in race car driving. He owned and operated Petersen Racing Enterprise for 13 years. While continuing to learn the family trade in oil and gas, he put together a resume as a formula race car driver and raced in many notable races around the world. Ultimately he came to the conclusion that while he was a "good" race car driver, alas he wasn't a "great" race car driver, and the pursuit of that dream ended.

His father founded Marlin Exploration, an independent oil and gas exploration company in 1960 via the merger of Petersen Petroleum and Petersen Drilling. Jon became the president of Marlin in 1982. Additionally, Jon's father founded Petersen Enterprises, which financed a few retail car dealerships. Jon became president of that company in 1984. Collectively Petersen Enterprise has owned Chevy Land-Shreveport, Intercontinental Motors a Mercedes Benz in Houston, BMW North in Houston, Marlin Imports, a Mercedes Benz dealership in Ft. Lauderdale, and Ron Fondren Chevrolet in Baton Rouge.

Today Jon's family owns the Team Automotive Group which is made up of Team Toyota, Automotive Finance Company and Team Honda, all of which are located in Baton Rouge. Team Honda is the largest volume retail dealership of any brand in the state of Louisiana. Jon also serves on the board of Louisiana Dealer Services.

In the oil and gas world, Jon remains President of Marlin Exploration LLC, Marlin Resources LLC, and Water Brothers Equipment LLC. In addition to the auto and oil and gas business obligations, Jon sits on the board of Maven Royalty Partners, a new start-up in Shreveport.

Keeping in mind Jon's philosophy, "you must participate in life," he has participated on several civic boards in Shreveport. He served on the Metro YMCA Board of Directors and as Chairman of the Board of Southern Trace Country Club. Jon also served as Chairman of the Board of the Christus Schumpert Foundation and Christus Schumpert Hospital as well as Sci-Port Discovery Center. While serving on the Christus Schumpert Board, he served as co-chair of fundraising for both Grace Home (Louisiana's first residential hospice facility) and Sutton's Children's Hospital.

Jon's mentors in life were his father, who had a great curiosity and familiarity with the scientific natural world, and also his grandfather, who was a Danish immigrant who loved to work and was the cornerstone of the family's success. Jon's grandfather was the founder of Blue Plate Foods in New Orleans, which created and owned the original patents on Wesson Oil and Snowdrift. Jon strongly believes that no matter how many financial resources one is born to, everyone must play a productive role in society. No one gets to just ride along; you must participate.

Jon is married to the former Michele Armstrong, and together they have three children – Megan Campbell, Ryan Q=Petersen and Preston Q=Petersen. Their children have produced 11 grandchildren for Michele and Jon. Life is damn good.


