Since its inception, LTP has bought and sold over 100,000 acres of timberland.





Chris Kinsey is a Shreveport native who grew up in the Ark-La-Tex and decided to return and stay after the conclusion of an eleven-year educational journey. 

Glenn Kinsey is a 3rd generation Kinsey in Shreveport and what today is Kinsey Interests. Norman Kinsey Sr. migrated to Shreveport from Elwood, IN. In 1919 after serving in WWI. Glenn's father, Norman Kinsey Jr, joined his father after serving in WWII.

Glenn's first paycheck from Kinsey Interests came in the summer of 1972 as he worked as a roustabout in the oil patch. He spent subsequent summers working on Transco Energy's pipeline in S. Louisiana and Georgia. He finally got a summer job in air conditioning as a production intern at KSLA.



Glenn's early formation outside of his parents came from Boy scouting. Scoutmaster Ken Finch and the other fathers around Troop 18 were tremendous mentors. This education in values and self-confidence was followed by 4 years at Culver Military Academy. The Culver experience expanded his moral foundation and taught him leadership by example. At Culver, Glenn was a member of the Black Horse Troop. He rode in the 1973 Presidential Inaugural Parade and competed at the Jr Olympics in Show Jumping. From Culver, he matriculated to Southern Methodist University where he earned a BBA in business and a BFA in broadcast film. After college, he sold radio advertising in the D/FW market.

In 1980, at age 25, he moved back to Shreveport to join the Family office. There he learned the meaning of financial risk as the '80s were not kind to the oil and gas business. Asset diversification began in earnest. Today energy represents about 25% of the asset base, and another 25% is private equity. Witnessing human ingenuity, grit, and hard work is amazing. His past Board service includes chairman LETA, Boy Scout Norwela Council, Goodwill Industries, President N. Shreveport Business Assoc. Shreveport Little Theater, Diocese of Shreveport, and St Joseph finance councils. He is a graduate of Leadership Louisiana and Leadership Shreveport. He is a member of St Joseph Catholic Church.

His life partner for the past 37 years is Ellen Sheridan Kinsey. Together they have 5 beautiful daughters. Each one is as different and brilliant as the stars. The youngest is Downs. She has been frightening, amazing, amusing, and humbling. Dr Ellen deserves credit for backing off her dental practice to be with the girls. 



ELEMENTARY PROGRAMS

JA Ourselves®

uses storybooks and hands-on activities to introduce the role people play in an economy. Through engaging, volunteer-led activities, young students learn about individual choices, the importance of saving and giving, and the value of work.

JA Career Speakers Series® (K-12)

JA Job Shadow™ College & Career Quest

HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMS



JA Be Entrepreneurial

Provides middle school students an opportunity to experience the initial steps necessary to start a business. New program content provides an authentic entrepreneurial experience for students, with each session building up to a product-pitch competition.

JA Personal Finance®

Explores the fundamental elements of personal finances: earnings, savings and investments, budgeting, credit, risk management, and giving. Students apply these elements to a personal financial plan that allows them to set specific goals for their lifelong financial needs and desired quality of life.

JA High School Heroes®

Equips students with the knowledge required to get and keep a job in high-growth industries. Students will explore the crucial workplace skills employers seek but often find lacking in young employees. Students also learn about valuable tools to find that perfect job, including resumes, cover letters, and interviewing techniques.

JA Job Shadow™

JA Empower: A Work Readiness Initiative

Prepares students for a visit to a professional workplace. After the site visit, students gather with community leaders for the JA Empower: Student & Mentor Lunch. Following a lively exercise in introductions and shaking hands and interview etiquette, roundtable discussions are used to teach students to hone their critical thinking, creativity, communication, and collaboration skills to complete worksheets with their mentors. They explore needs and wants, ethics in business, resume building and interview skills. Students leave with a clearer understanding of how classroom learning connects to life outside of the classroom and gain an increased understanding of the importance of staying in school.

JA Take Stock In Your Future®

Introduces students to the stock market. This program may include two components: a classroom curriculum, and for many participants, the JA Stock Market Challenge competition event. Five sessions introduce students to basic concepts about how the stock market works and the impact orf eciurrent events on the stock market. The program includes self-guided extension activities that engage students in deeper learning about the stock market and investing.
